

ABOUT TRAILL COLLEGE

Traill is Trent University's oldest college, founded in 1964. Named after nineteenth-century author and naturalist Catharine Parr Traill, the college has forged a unique identity as Trent's downtown location. Its alumni are fiercely loyal and include prominent politicians, lawyers, screenwriters, professors, teachers, scientists, and a Nobel prize laureate. It is a place for students of all ages and interests.

Like Catharine Parr Traill herself, the college has a foot firmly placed in both literary and scientific worlds. We believe that the future of the humanities is in its power to foster meaningful conversations, the ability to promote a greater appreciation of human achievement, and the potential to bring about momentous change in our communities.

At Traill College, you can find a blend of more traditional undergraduate departments, such as English Literature, with cross-disciplinary programs, such as Canadian Studies and Cultural Studies. Added into this mix is Media Studies, making Traill a dynamic hub for cutting-edge classes and critical conversations in the humanities. This rarified academic milieu is further enhanced by graduate programs in Public Texts, Cultural Studies, Canadian Studies, and History.

Traill is also known as the "law college" where the university's Law Dual Degree Program is situated. The state-of-the-art Bagnani Hall doubles as the law lab, complete with a full set of courtroom furniture.



Traill College is an ecosystem of opportunities, relationships, and meaningful exchanges. As founding President Tom Symons envisioned, Traill is a community of learners where each new meaningful relationship or string of connections means that there are no limits to learning and no formal designations needed between learning and 'non-learning' spaces. The Traill Endowment was founded to help provide a financially sustainable future for the College. The goal is to raise at least \$100K a year until a total endowment of \$1 million has been realized. The interest from the Endowment will provide the Principal of Traill College with discretionary funds to support the College's vision, including:

- Costs of visiting speakers and associated social functions
- Development of exciting student activities and engaging programs, including college dinners, academic supports, and career development opportunities
- Improvement of amenities available in the existing common rooms, library, and college restaurant.

Traill College Capital Endowment

Over three centuries of architecture is showcased at Traill College. To meet current needs, Traill's older buildings need key upgrades and several new structures are required. Both objectives are only possible through your generous support. We offer naming opportunities that will appropriately recognize a legacy of consequence. Current initiatives include:

- Completion of the Jalynn Bennett Amphitheatre, which will see Traill College becoming a hub for arts and culture in Peterborough
- Continued upgrades and expansion of classrooms, seminar, and studio spaces
- Landscaping, signage, and accessible pathways.

Traill College Amphitheatre Sustainability Endowment

Founded by former principals James and Lynn Neufeld, this fund will specifically support the development of programming for the Jalynn Bennett Amphitheatre and help fund its continued operations and maintenance.

Traill College Sherouse Fund

Nancy Sherouse (1929-1999) was the second principal of Traill College who was much beloved by students, faculty, and staff alike. Referred to as the "soul of Traill, the soul of Trent," she served as college principal for 13 years and focused on the wellbeing of students. After her death, an endowment was established that would give the principal immediate, discretionary funds to improve the student experience or offer emergency support.
